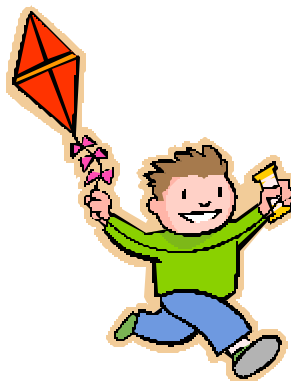


Paper Bag Flyaway Kite

What You Need:

Large brown paper grocery bag

Strong string

Scissors

Hole punch

Paper ring reinforcement (the kind you use on paper in binders -- from any office supply store or masking tape.)

Glue

Paint, crayons, markers, construction paper, your choice.

Paper streamers or crepe paper -cut into strips.

What to Do:

1. Take the hole punch and make 4 holes in the top of the bag, one in each corner.
2. Add paper ring reinforcements, or use masking tape and poke a hole with a pencil or the punch.
3. Cut 3 pieces of string, each about 30 inches. Use 2 pieces of the string to tie to the holes in the bag, creating two loops. Next, use the other piece of string and loop through the two loops you created already, and tie in a knot. This piece of string will be the handle of your kite.
4. Create Butterflies on the paper bag kite using paint, markers, construction paper or whatever else you desire. Be sure not to load the kite down with heavy items, or it will have trouble flying.
5. Use the paper streamers as kite tails and glue them to the bottom of the paper bag. You can make your own streamers by cutting crepe paper into strips. Another nifty streamer idea is to take plastic bags and cut them into strips.
6. When the glue and paint is dry the kite is ready to go. Hold on tightly to the string handle and run so that the wind catches the kite. When the bag fills with air it will float and flutter behind you.
